Statement of Need: As planners of a Pediatric Emergency Medicine (PEM) conference, the platform this year emphasizes the basic skills of our profession. This includes navigating difficult airways, respiratory distress, cardiac arrest, and toxic ingestions. In the wake of a surge in pediatric respiratory illness, these practices have been extremely important. Professional practice gaps result from not all healthcare providers being constantly up-todate on the most recently discovered evidence-based practices in PEM, specifically in trauma care and use of simulations for education.
