Statement of need: Although many practitioners (physicians, residents, fellows, advanced practice providers, nurses, psychologists, rehabilitation specialists, therapists) are involved in the care of neurotrauma patients, few have chosen to specialize in the complete care of traumatic brain, spinal cord, or peripheral nerve injury and may be unfamiliar with the nuances of their complex management, such as tiered ICP care and the new ICP management algorithm that has been published. Additionally, new research and clinical treatment paradigms are constantly being updated with new studies, trials, and guidelines. Case-based examples of management will be designed to discuss and educate on the myriad treatment options available. There is a need to increase awareness of the disparities in neurotrauma care both regionally and globally. Additionally, attendees will be updated on current research and clinical topics including cortical spreading depolarization, anticoagulation reversal and resumption after TBI, and prolonged concussion, and how these relate to the modern management of the neurotrauma patient.

Program objectives: All Northwell Health CME activities are intended to improve patient care, safety and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Evaluate the latest treatments for peripheral nerve injury patients, including research updates and new technologies to help with recovery.
- Assess the current literature and management paradigms for anticoagulation reversal and resumption following traumatic brain injury, particularly in the geriatric population.
- Discuss the implications of health care disparities with respect to the global burden of neurotrauma and delivery of care to patients with brain, spine, and peripheral nerve injuries.

Target audience: This program is designed for physicians, psychologists and pharmacists. Other members of the health care team who work in the area of Neurotrauma, including RNs, NPs, PAs and PTs are invited to participate.
