Statement of need: The conference endeavors to present multiple topics relevant to the practice of neurotrauma, reviewing current practices and presenting new information to attendees to provide broader knowledge for improving neurotrauma care. This activity will present new information on pediatric injury prevention education, mitigation of post traumatic stress disorder after TBI, use of beta blockers in traumatic brain injury, early rehabilitation in neurotrauma, an update on treatment of cerebrovascular injury, use of spinal cord stimulators in spinal cord injury, evaluation of outcome measures and their impact on research in TBI and SCI, and new techniques in craniofacial reconstruction.

Program objectives: All Northwell Health CME activities are intended to improve patient care, safety and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Assess the role of neuromodulation in the treatment of paralysis in patients with spinal cord injury.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of beta blocker therapy in patients with severe traumatic brain injury.
- **Apply** techniques in craniofacial reconstruction after traumatic brain injury.

Target audience: This activity was planned by and for physicians, physician assistants, pharmacists, psychologists, and nurses. All other members of the health care team who are interested in neurotrauma are welcome to attend.
