

# PROGRAM INFORMATION

**Statement of need:** The morbidity and mortality of cancer is still a public health crisis. Liver cancer, in particular, has one of the worst survival rates. Increased knowledge of new treatment methodologies, new research being done in the disease and how to best care for the patient with liver cancer are vital to improving the survival rate of patients with liver cancer. Each year more and more research is being done in liver cancer requiring physicians and advanced clinical providers to have knowledge of new medications used to treat the disease. New to cancer diagnosis and treatment is the use of molecular biology and genetic testing. It has been found that different molecular abnormalities of liver cancer react differently to different medications to treat liver cancer. Providing our learners with the extensive knowledge of new treatment and diagnostic modalities including molecular and genetic testing in correlation to the appropriate therapy to treat a liver cancer patient is of utmost importance.

**Target audience:** This activity was planned by and for physicians, nurses, and physician assistants. All other members of the health care team who are interested in education about liver care are invited to attend.

**Program objectives:** All Northwell Health CME activities are intended to improve patient care, safety, and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:
