GENERAL INFORMATION

Statement of need: Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women, highlighting the need for effective lifestyle changes and medical interventions. However, preventive strategies for women have often been overlooked, resulting in delayed diagnoses and treatment.
